

# INSTRUCTIONS OF HFH/HFMG PATHOLOGY'S WEB-BASED LABORATORY USER'S GUIDE (LUG)

## **What is it?**

It is the web-based HFH/HFMG Laboratory User's Guide that contains a complete and up to date test catalog (including tests performed at reference laboratories), specimen collection instructions, specimen submission requirements, information about the various laboratory services, and contact information.

## **How do I find information about a test?**

You can search by:

Test Name  
Test Code  
Synonym/Alias

or

Performing Lab

or

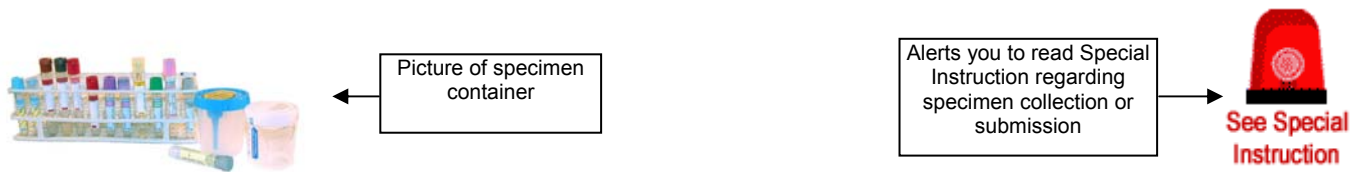
Alpha Character

If you know the laboratory section where the test is performed, you may search by Performing Lab. Simply click the down arrow and select the lab section you desire from the menu and click the "Go" icon. All tests performed in that lab section will display.

If you only know that a test starts with a particular letter, click on that letter. All test codes, test names and synonyms that begin with that letter will display. It is not necessary to click the "Go" icon when searching by alpha character.

Reminder: Always click on the "Go" icon to initiate the search when searching by Test Name or Performing Lab.

- Name of the specimen container (points to Specimen Container)
- Misys test code if the test is orderable in Misys (points to Test Code)
- Amount of specimen that is normally collected (points to Collect Volume)
- Minimum amount of specimen required for the test (points to Min Volume)
- When the test is performed or can be sent for testing (points to Availability)
- Whether the test can be done STAT or Routine (points to Test Priority)

Where appropriate, you will also find information about Collection Instructions, Storage and Transport Instructions, the proper request form to use, the Performing Laboratory, approximate Turnaround Time, Specimen Type, Causes for Rejection, and Principle/Methodology. Important information about the test is included in the Note section. In the future, important information about the test that is relevant for laboratory employees only will appear in the In-House Note. Reference Ranges are also provided, wherever appropriate, **as a general guideline only**. The reference ranges reflect HFH test methods. Since reference ranges are method specific and may vary depending upon where the test is performed, **the provider should always refer to the reference range that accompanies the test result in CarePlus.**

## Set query condition for test report

**Search (Test Code, Name, Alias):**  **Go**

**Search by Performing Lab:**

**Test Name Search**

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If you know the name of the test or the test code, type as many of the letters as you are sure of and click the "Go" icon. Any tests with the combination of letters you type in will display. Reminder: The more letters you type in, the narrower the search will be and the less tests that will meet the search criteria.

If you know the laboratory section where the test is performed, you may search by Performing Lab. Simply click the down arrow and select the lab section you desire from the menu and click the "Go" icon.

If you only know that a test starts with a particular letter, click on that letter. All test codes, test names and synonyms that begin with that letter will display. It is not necessary to click the "Go" icon to initiate the search.

Reminder: You must click the "Go" icon each time to initiate a search by Test Code, Name, Alias, or a search by Performing Lab.

### Helpful Hints:

- You can sort the results from a search or query in alphabetical order based on Test Name, Alias, Code, or Profile by simply clicking the desired header; e.g., click Test Name to sort all tests from a search in alphabetical order based on the test name.
